### Person Specification – Student Health and Welfare support worker (N4)

#### Part A: Application Stage

The following criteria (experience, skills and qualifications) will be used to short-list at the application stage:

##### Essential

1	Experience of working with children or young people with special educational needs
2	NVQ Level 2 or 3 for Teaching Assistants or equivalent qualification and experience
3	Level 2 Basic Skills (Literacy or numeracy) or equivalent
4	Basic ICT skills, i.e. ability to use internet explorer and Microsoft Office

##### Desirable

5	Experience of supporting children or young people who have complex health needs
6	Experience of augmentative communications systems
7	Experience of working collaboratively within multi-agency teams, for example, with nursing, physiotherapy and speech and language therapy colleagues

#### Part B: Assessment Stage

Items 1 - 4 of the application stage criteria and the criteria below will be further explored at the assessment stage:

##### Essential

1	Able to undertake observations and assessments of a designated student's health, welfare and educational needs
2	Able to follow identified healthcare and clinical procedures to ensure that a designated student's health and welfare needs are met
3	Ability to work as part of a class team in supporting and progressing the learning needs of young people who have significant learning difficulties, physical disabilities and complex health needs
4	Able to contribute effectively to the planning of teaching programmes
5	Able to work calmly and methodically following set procedures, to address an individual student's health or welfare need
6	Appropriate behaviour and attitude towards safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ motivation to work with children and young people</li><li>▪ ability to form and maintain appropriate relationships and personal boundaries with children and young people</li><li>▪ emotional resilience in working with challenging behaviours</li><li>▪ attitude to use of authority and maintaining discipline.</li></ul>
7	No disclosure about criminal convictions or safeguarding concern that makes applicant unsuitable for this post.

##### Desirable

8	Experience of safe moving and handling techniques in supporting students with a physical disability
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9	Experience of delivering intimate care programmes, including mealtime programmes
