Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year to you all, we wanted to write to you at the beginning of this New Year to pass on a few reminders as we move into 2022.

Cold weather

Firstly we are asking parents to ensure that all students come into school with warm coats and suitable shoes for being outside in damp or cold weather. As part of our ongoing efforts to reduce the risks of Covid-19 we will be continuing to ask students to be outside as often as possible for breaks and lunchtimes. If you need support with this please do get in touch with our student support team.

Sicknesses within school

We are aware that the guidelines for testing and isolations around Covid-19 continue to change, however as a school we also need to be protective against other illnesses at this time of year. If your child is feeling unwell and will not be able to engage with their day at school they should remain at home until they feel well enough to manage the school day. If your child has symptoms of sickness and/or diarrhoea they should remain off school for forty eight hours from the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.

School uniform

School Uniform – years 7 to 11.

The school has a uniform which consists of:

- A pale blue polo shirt (with or without the school logo);
