"Maximising opportunities; enriching lives"


Our daily task is to ensure that every day, every one of our students:


feels safe and enjoys their day in school;

The responsibility of parents and carers

- make the school aware of any concerns that might affect their child's performance in school
- attend their child's annual review meeting and parents' evenings
- get to know and take an interest in their child's life at school
- encourage their child's learning through homework (where appropriate) and other activities
- support the school's positive behaviour policy and uniform code
